## Assessment criteria for term papers and presentations in Classical Archaeology

- i) Language: differentiated expression, homogeneous language style; grammatical and lexical correctness; avoidance of colloquial language as well as superfluous technical jargon; explanation of special technical terms.
- ii) Form and layout: clear, uniform manuscript/slide layout (text, scientific references, bibliography, illustrations); avoidance of typographical errors; use of images to clarify and enhance the argument.
- iii) Scientific context: comprehensive review of the state of research on the given topic; consideration of the entire literature spectrum (handbooks, special literature in monographs and articles, reviews). Both as appropriate for the level of the student.
- iv) Scientific evidence: use of both primary and secondary sources with citation; consistent reference system (author-year with bibliography).
- v) Structure and presentation of argument: consistent, clearly structured outline of the material; appropriate detail given to the individual subjects. For presentations: present freely at least in the descriptive sections.
- vi) Independence of scientific analysis: proof of the ability to deal critically with sources and to weigh competing ideas and evidence against one another; demonstrate independent thinking beyond a narrow framework; quotations of text, the summary of concepts, and any use of another's ideas must be marked as such without exception, in term papers as well as in presentations. Plagiarism will result in a "fail" grade and may have further repercussions.
- vii) Ambition and originality of the topic: independence in the definition of the topic, degree of analytical requirements, standard of source research.
